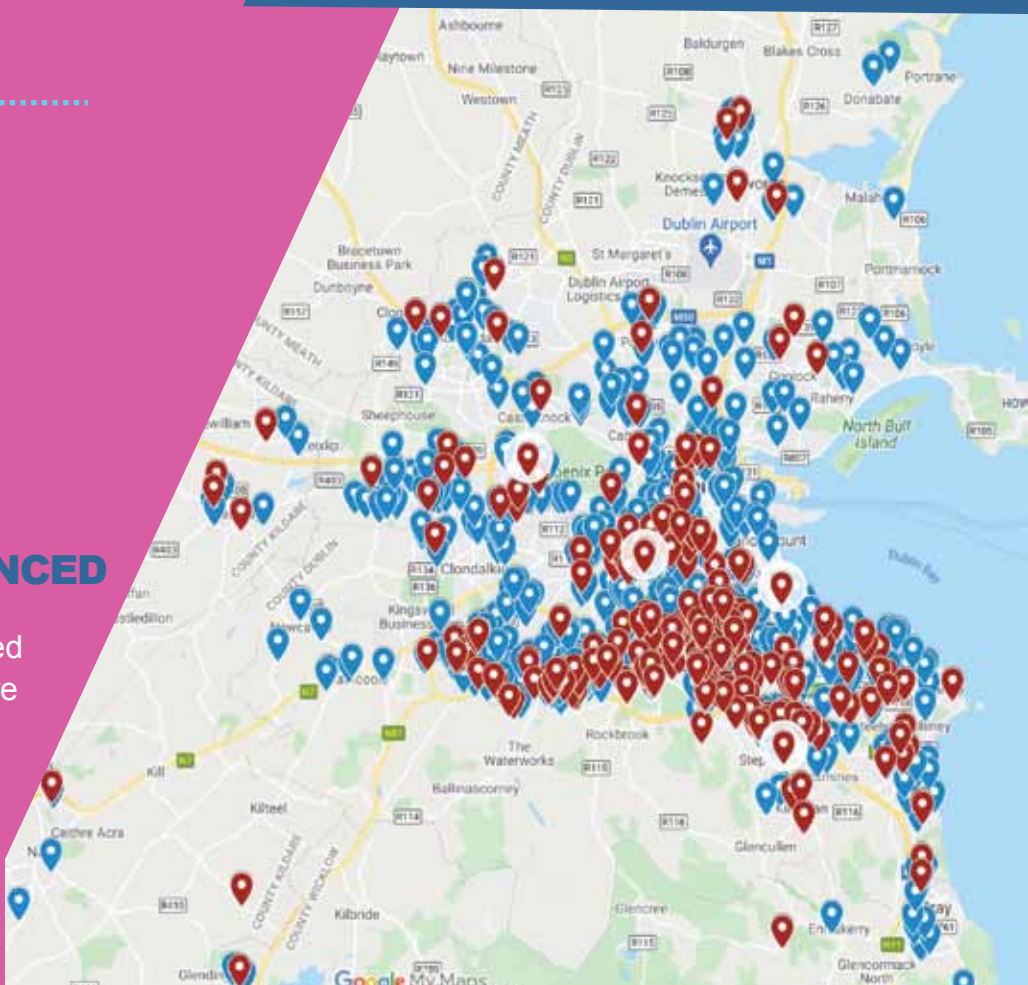

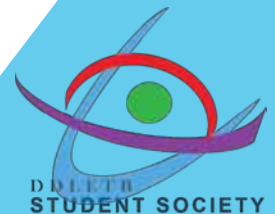

DCFE is situated in the heart of Dundrum community and adjacent to Dundrum Town Centre. The College buildings are situated both on Dundrum Main Street and Upper Kilmacud Road.

The college is only a few minutes from town on the Luas, well served by Dublin, Transport for Ireland and on a bus route from Dublin Airport. DCFE is also handy for the M50.

Dundrum is a thriving mix of old and new amenities, with the village itself redeveloped and lined with cottages that bring character and a real sense of community, while maintaining the 'small village' sense.

There is also ample green space nearby in Airfield Estate and Ballawley Park. There is a fantastic range of supports, clubs, restaurants, sports facilities and gyms, creches, a library, churches and parks close to the college. Dundrum Town Centre, which is Ireland's largest shopping centre, is only a few steps from our campus.

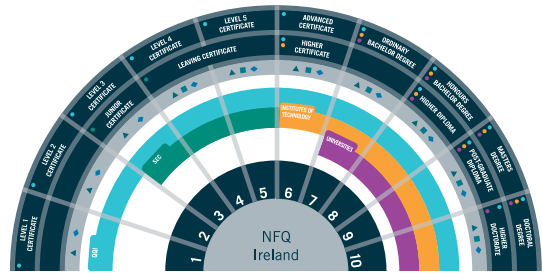


PROGRESSION PATHWAYS

EARLY LEARNING & CARE

Overview

The one-year full-time equivalent programme leads to a Level 5 Certificate in Early Learning and Care. The programme is designed to meet the QQI professional award standards for early learning and care at NFQ level 5. The programme comprises six mandatory modules encompassing the knowledge, skills and competence required to work at entry level across a range of early learning and care settings or to progress to stage 2 of the Advanced Certificate in Early Learning and Care or to a relevant higher education programme. The focus is on providing for the holistic well-being, development and learning needs of children from 0 to six years across a range of ELC settings. The programme offers a balance of theory and practice, and professional practice placement is integral to the teaching and learning.

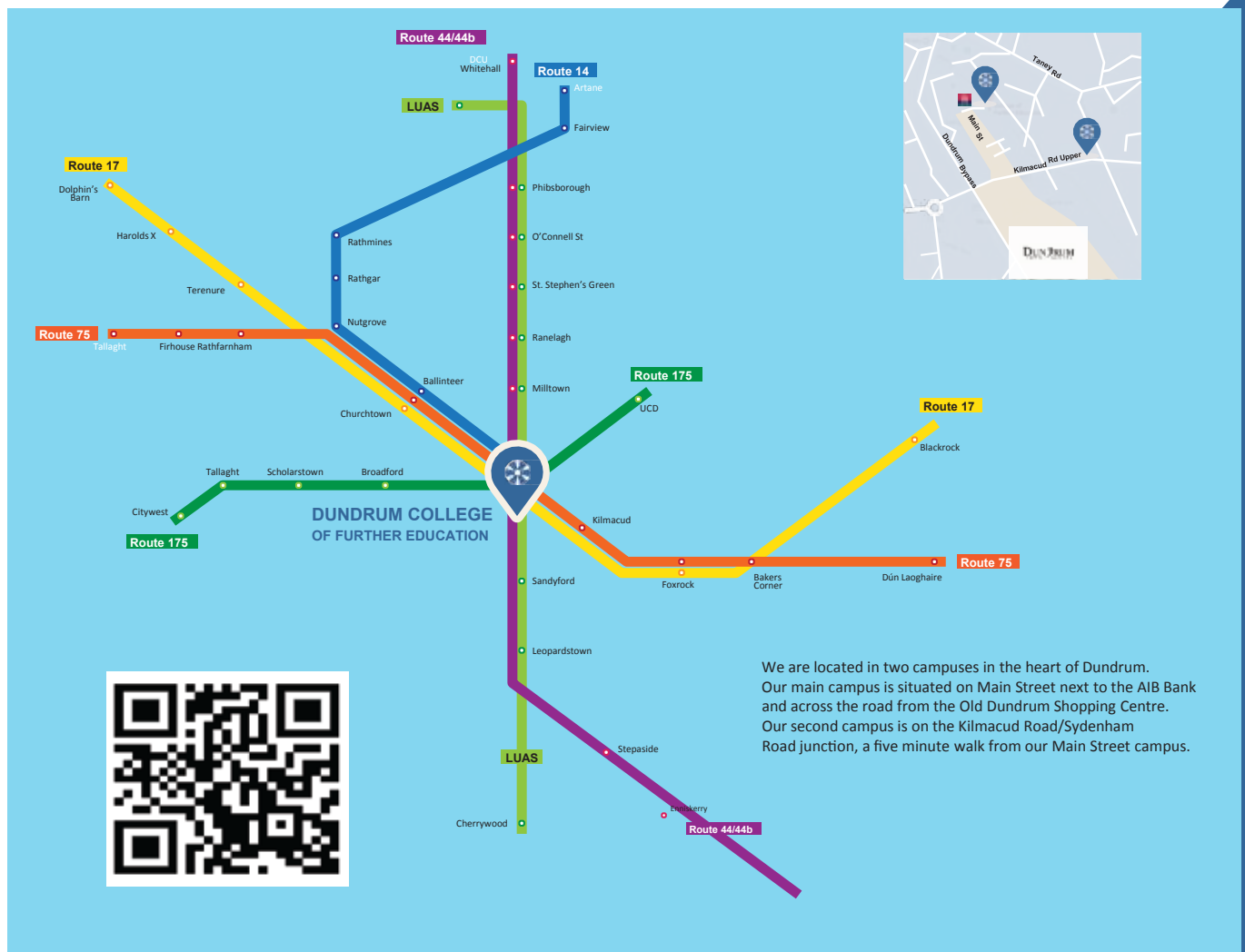
